<http://www.bethinking.org/> An apologetics site, the mission of “bethinking.org” is “bring together the best possible resources for thinking about and communicating the Christian faith. Its goal is to help to prepare all Christians to provide an answer to those who deny the truth of Christianity.” It provides many articles on key subjects of the Christian faith by authors such as Josh McDowell, William Lane Craig, Gary R. Habermas, John Lennox, Alister McGrath, etc.

<http://www.bestcommentaries.com/> A one-stop guide to the best biblical study references, especially commentaries, as suggested by Christian schools, professors and pastors. By consulting this site, you may save yourself lots of money and time by buying the best as judged by many of our colleagues and mentors.

[www.biblegateway.org](http://www.biblegateway.org) Perhaps the most familiar “gateway” to Bible study online, this site provides easy “passage lookup,” “keyword search” and “topical index” for virtually anything in the Bible. You can choose to study using English, Spanish and many other versions of the Bible. It provides online commentary support for many NT books (InterVarsity Press and Matthew Henry). There are numerous other features that might be explored.

<http://www.bibleportal.com/> One of the most comprehensive sites for Bible study, this site provides several commentaries, including the entire set of John Calvin. It also provides concordance, dictionary and encyclopedia help. It also includes numerous audio sermons from many well-known pastors and teachers.

<http://www.biblestudytools.com/> Another wide-ranging site with numerous accessible commentary sets, dictionaries and encyclopedia. It includes interlinear Bibles for both Greek and Hebrew, a parallel Bible search (searching a verse or word in two versions simultaneously) and numerous other helpful features, one of which is a lexicon (dictionary) that defines both Greek and Hebrew terms.

<http://www.biblewalks.com/> If the geography of the land of Israel will help you understand and teach a passage of Scripture, this is a very helpful site to visit. It “assists in Bible research and reference, conducts virtual tours to the Holy land places, and absorbs the spirit of the Biblical life from the ground up.”

[www.biblia.com](http://www.biblia.com) “Part of a family of services from Logos Bible Software, it offers free access to a collection of Bibles and Bible reference works, with an easy user interface and powerful search engine.” This is a new site which promises to bring not just numerous searchable translations of the Bible to the student, but other Logos reference works, as well. Logos Bible Software arguably offers the best study tools for purchase and use on a computer. This site is not nearly as developed at this point (April 2011) as others in this list.

<http://www.biblica.com/> This is the newer name for the International Bible Society, publisher of the NIV Bible.

This site offers searches of the NIV Bible and essays and notes from the NIV Study Bible. It provides helpful outlines and introductions to all the books of the Bible.

[www.biblos.org](http://www.biblos.org) Probably the most comprehensive Bible study site of all! It provides the widest range of commentaries, dictionaries, encyclopedias, lexicons and atlases of any site we've seen. It includes a Bible timeline and many, many other helpful resources. It has extensive resources in both English and Spanish. This is a great place to start your online study of the Bible. It may be the only place you go.

[www.carm.org](http://www.carm.org) This is a largely apologetic site, addressing questions regarding our faith and confronting misinterpretations of our faith and heretical points of view. It is a good place to begin your study of cults. It provides helpful links to other sites to continue your study.

The studies are offered by many contributors from the vast Christianity Today community. One can search the database of Bible studies by topic or biblical reference. There is often a charge for the articles.

<http://www.crosswalk.com/> A site filled with articles, blogs, podcasts and even ecards. It provides a search engine for biblical study which actually takes the searcher to the BibleStudyTools site mentioned above. One nice thing about this site is that it addresses and speaks to current controversial issues.

It contains thousands of accessible illustrations and sample sermons and lessons, most of them reserved for those who are paying members. Some, however, are available to for free.
